smirk (verb) - An affected, often offensively self-satisfied smile

indulgent (adj) - lenient

enthral (verb) - to hold spellbound; captivate

infuriate (verb) - to make furious; enrage

contradict (verb) - to assert or express the opposite of (a statement)

incompetent (adj) - unqualified, inadequate, unfit

tirade (noun) - A long angry or violent speech

revolution (noun) - a fundamental change in power or organizational structures that takes place in a relatively short period of time

Capitalism (noun) - (think market economy) An economic system that features private ownership of the means of production (such as factories, offices, and shipping enterprises) and in which market forces determine the way in which goods are produced and the means by which income and profit are distributed

Socialism (noun) - (think command economy) a way of organizing a society in which major industries are owned and controlled by the government rather than by individual people and companies

On the FRONT of the flashcard, write the prefix or suffix. On the BACK, write the three words that follow the definition, and use one word per prefix/ suffix in a sentence that allows you to understand the word's meaning.

en (prefix) – in (enlighten, enroll, enrage)

-ism (suffix) – the belief in (terrorism, communism, monotheism)
