- You will be contacted by the ASE instructor to confirm your child's ASE schedule. Please pay careful attention to class dates and duration, as some classes are longer than others.

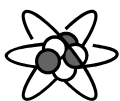

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Class Descriptions

BASKETBALL: Learn the basics or improve your game; scrimmage and enjoy some friendly game time!!

BEGINNING KNITTING: Come learn the basic skills of knitting. Please bring a skein of yarn and a pair of knitting needles to class.

CHEERLEADING. Students will participate in cheers, stunts, dance and tumbling. Led by Lisa Humphries and two cheerleaders from North Meck High School.

CLAY CLASS: Explore many different type of clay from clay we make from scratch, clay from Lake Norman, and clay that is bought in the store. We will make sculptures in the round, bas relief sculptures and relief sculptures. It is an introduction to the many wonders of clay!!! Lots of treasures will be made that moms and dads will want to save forever!!!

CSD FUTURE CHEFS: Students will learn about good eating habits and how to prepare healthy snacks and desserts. Students will use reading, writing and math skills while reading recipes, preparing the recipes, and constructing a recipe collection to take home at the end of class.

DROP IN ART: Presented by Community Arts Project (CAP), a local nonprofit group that operates CCS' in-class art program, Drop-in Art involves mixed media for all ages. \$8 per hour or 10 hours for \$70. Multiple discounts apply! The first 2 children are full price; each additional child receives a 50% discount. Additional hours are discounted 50%.

FASHION ART 101: Fashion-Art 101 is an introductory class where students are introduced to the ins and outs of the fashion industry. They are also introduced to fashion design by learning about and practicing the creative design process. Specific topics covered include Careers in fashion, Finding your Creativity, Age appropriate style, Color theory, Fashion Drawing, Fashion Draping, and Portfolio Creation. The class is designed to help young people find their creative voice and in doing so to honor the uniqueness and beauty of that voice. The results are children with a better sense of fashion and the fashion industry but more importantly a better sense of self.

FLAG FOOTBALL is back! Work on your skills as we scrimmage and enjoy some friendly game time!!

FUN HOUSE: Hi Kids! Come design, build, paint, and decorate a house for your littlest pets, dolls, or favorite play characters using wood and recycled materials. You will get a chance to be an architect and designer and play with your friends! (if you can bring in recycled materials such as egg cartons, toilet paper rolls, yogurt cups, lids, etc. from home to share, that would be great!)

FUN WITH DIARY OF A WIMPY KID BOOKS: If you enjoy Jeff Kinney's Diary of a Wimpy Kid books, then this is the class for you! To help celebrate the new release of Dog Days by Jeff Kinney, students will create their own comic strips, play games and participate in activities related to the series, act out favorite parts of the books, journal, and enjoy discussions of Jeff Kinney's books. The child does not need to own any of the books to participate.

GINGERBREAD CREATIONS: Students will design, bake, build and decorate their own gingerbread creations in time for the holidays. Each student will learn how to make and bake the gingerbread dough and master royal frosting and decorate building and landscape with candy, cereals, pretzels. Designs can be whimsical or realistic, modern or Victorian but guaranteed, each student will have a one-of-a-kind masterpiece.

GLOBAL GIFTS: Each week we will explore a different, cultural celebration and make a gift to reflect our learning. Children will have an opportunity to: learn about other cultures, engage in songs and dances of other lands and make new friends. At the end of the session children will have a full passport and several family gifts, just in time for the holidays!

GUITAR PRESTO: A young beginner approach to Guitar instruction. Learn the art of playing the guitar. Each child will learn music theory, proper techniques, ear training, rhythmic reading, and finger geography of the guitar. The lessons will be taught through a musical based curriculum guidebook.

GUYS FIT FOR LIFE: This class is designed to prepare young children to excel in every area of their life. There will be a developmentally appropriate fitness curriculum that will prepare the boys for a 5k (Jingle Jog 12/13). We will also have a personal, nutrition & health, social and moral component to teach values that will lead to success in all areas of life.

Class Descriptions

HARNESS THE POWER OF YOUR POSITIVE THINKING: Through experiences of journaling, vision boards, inspirational quotes, nature walks and deep breathing, students will have the opportunity to connect with their authentic self. My intention is for students to value their uniqueness, experience the power of gratitude and understand that their thoughts have a direct correlation to the world they live in. With an open mind and heart, anything is possible!

LET'S PLAY!: Each week, kids will enjoy playing with games, puzzles, arts&crafts, and building toys (eg.blocks, K'NEX, Geomags,etc.). Kids can choose one activity for the whole hour or try a few; friends will have a great time playing together!

OLYMPIC FENCING: This class is taught by Jeff Kallio of Charlotte Fencing Academy. Coach Kallio has been involved with fencing for 12 years and has coached and competed at the national level. He is offering an Olympic fencing course for CCS in which students will learn and practice the fundamentals of this fast paced and exciting Olympic sport. Students age 8 and up are welcome and the cost is \$90 session, which includes the use of all equipment. The class will meet on Thursday afternoons for one hour, with a minimum class size of 6 and a maximum of 14. For more information about our sport please visit charlottefencing.com.

PIANO PRESTO: A young beginners approach to piano instruction. This fun-filled piano class will teach your child rhythm reading, geographic location of the letter names on the keyboard, and will develop the five-finger dexterity of both hands. Your child will be able to play familiar songs by the end of this program.

THEATRE PLAY BEGINNINGS: Join Davidson Community Player's Sara Provencal for a fun filled beginning exploration of the art of acting. Students will experience a broad range of theatre games and storytelling techniques while learning basic performance skills. Students work as members of a team, building important cooperation and collaboration skills. Opportunities for individual and small group work will build self confidence, all in a laid back, fun atmosphere. The session culminates with an original sharing for family and friends.

THEATRE PLAY & IMPROVISATION: This year's drama ensemble will be led by professional actress Greta Zandstra in collaboration with Melissa Ohlman-Roberge, CCS parent, & Davidson Community Players. (CCS students saw Greta in Children's Theatre's *New Kid* among other productions.) This semester long class will expose students to basic acting technique, cool theater games, and improvisation, leading to an original sharing in December. KID'S YOGA. In the Yoga class students will learn basic postures, learning about the breath and techniques to calm the mind. They will work on the importance of both speaking and listening. Movement, breath and the concept of 'stilling the mind' all work together to introduce the kids to early yoga.
